Cheeseburger Soup

- 1/2 pound ground beef
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 3/4 cup chopped carrots
- 3/4 cup chopped celery
- 1 tsp. dried basil
- 1 tsp. dried parsley
- 4 Tbsp. butter

- 3 cups chicken broth
- 4 cups cubed potatoes
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour

Millar Angus Approved

- 2 cups shredded cheese
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 1/4 cup sour cream

In large pot, melt 1 Tbsp butter and cook onion, carrots, celery and beef until browned, drain. Stir in basil and parsley. Add broth and potatoes. Bring to a boil, then simmer until potatoes are tender, approx. 10-15 minutes. In separate bowl, melt remainder of butter and stir in flour. Add milk and stir until smooth. Gradually add milk mixture to soup, stirring constantly. Bring to a boil and reduce to simmer. Stir in cheese. When cheese is melted add sour cream. Do not boil.


