One Wing Ranch - Tyson & Shiloh Hewitt Mud Butte, SD

A little bit about the One Wing Ranch: Here at the One Wing Ranch we are primarily a cow calf program that calves in April/May. We haul everything to summer grass so we try to be done calving by the 1st of June so our bulls are out for 45 days to try to tighten that calving window up and get those girls to grass. The last half dozen years or so we have been selling the heavy steer calves straight off the cow and keeping all the heifer calves and the light steers. Over the years there have been fewer and fewer light steers that didn't fit the main bunch and that has been real fun to see. We select our replacement heifers right before turnout in the spring and then run the light heifers and steers to sell off grass late summer/early fall.

Millar Angus genetics on the One Wing Ranch: This is totally a family operation, so as I (Tyson) spend more time on the road trying to sell ranch real estate or line up an equipment auction to do with Colonel Jon the girls

are becoming more independent on taking care of things on their own. That being said, docility is very important as well as bulls that will produce females who can work through the winter, calve unassisted, raise a good calf and breed back in a tight window. Millar Angus Bulls deliver in all those areas, my favorite bull being a thick Tombstone son we got some great years out of. Jon and Breezy have always been great whether you're talking with them in the bullpen, working a sale somewhere, or at a community event and it is fun to see Ryle and Lexie getting their program off and running as well! Thanks for everything you all are doing at Millar Angus and keep those Bull Shippin wheels turnin'!

Roast Beef Sliders

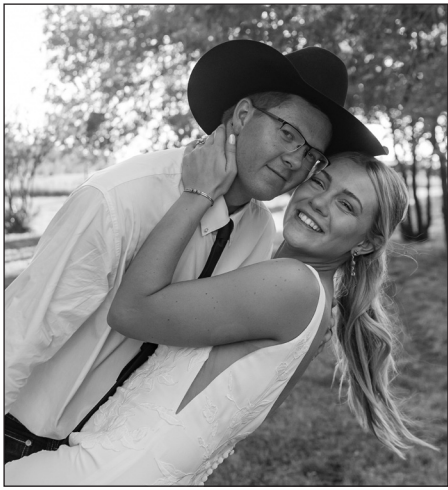

APPROVED

- Hawaiian Rolls (I get a couple packages so I can make 32 sliders at a time)
- Mayo
- Thin sliced roast beef lunchmeat
- Provolone (or your favorite) cheese
- 4 Tbsp. unsalted butter, melted
- 1 Tbsp. mustard
- 1 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 tsp. poppyseeds

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease or line baking sheet with parchment paper. Slice rolls horizontally, keeping them in tact so the tops and bottoms of the rolls are separated in two large pieces. Spread bottom buns with mayo. Top bottom buns with 1-2 slices of roast beef per bun. Then, place cheese slices over roast beef. Bake for 10 minutes, allowing the cheese to melt. Meanwhile, combine melted butter, mustard, garlic powder and poppyseeds in a bowl. Remove pan from oven and add the top rolls. Brush or pour the butter mixture evenly over the rolls. Cover with foil and bake 10 minutes. Remove foil and bake an additional 10 minutes.
